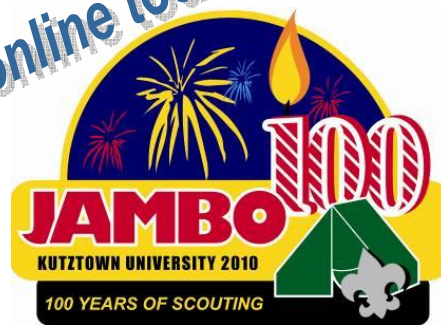

SCHEDULE:

Friday, May 14 – Check-in and setup for ALL camping begins Friday at 5:00 p.m. Cub and Scoutmaster meetings will be held at 9:00 p.m. during the evening's Cub and Scout program events.

Saturday, May 15 – Opening Ceremonies begin at 8:45 a.m. Open program between 9:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m. Lunch scheduled from 12:00 noon to 1:30 p.m. Program areas remain open during lunch. Dinner between 5:00 p.m. and 6:30 p.m. with a special evening program scheduled to start at 7:00 p.m.

Sunday, May 16 – Non denominational services and Mass will begin at 9:00 a.m. followed by designated-area clean up and campsite cleanup.

CAMPSITE ORGANIZATION:

JAMBO100 camping will be divided into three large sub-camps with Boy Scouts, Venturers, and Cub Scout Family Camping all having their own designated camping areas. We hope you are getting excited about camping at JAMBO100! This year, all camping will be on the North Campus, near the action. We are working to make certain that all of you get the most out of your

weekend, and that you can be as close as possible to all the events.



One very important item that we are trying to set up is electricity for medical needs. We have established a special email address, jambo2010camping@verizon.net for you to let us know of your medical needs for electricity and this email address is available on the registration form.

Medical needs may include: a CPAP machine for a person with sleep apnea or someone needing a nebulizer. There may be other medical needs, and we are asking you to identify your specific medical need. Note that electricity supply is only for medical devices not for charging cell phones, operation of coffee pots, blowing up air mattresses, or other non-medical needs.

The supply of electricity for medical needs is limited and will take some work to safely run the necessary wires. Therefore, the areas where electricity will be available will be very limited. If you don't tell us when you register, you will not have electricity available at JAMBO100. In addition, we will contact you to verify your specific medical needs and our ability to meet those medical needs.

We are also working with the First Aid staff to provide refrigeration for medications if necessary. This need should also be identified in an email to the same address, jambo2010camping@verizon.net. Again, send us your concerns at the same time you register your unit.

PACK LIGHT! Keep in mind that you should only pack the unit gear that you will need for a two night stay in a congested camping area. We fully realize that each unit has basic needs (dining fly, cooking/cleanup area, tent area), but please understand that this is not the same as camping at summer camp. Did we say **PACK LIGHT!**

The overall area for campers, although larger than at past JAMBO's, is still limited. We are expecting a record crowd this year, and we want everybody to have a great time so PACK LIGHT! It will be much better for all if you bring only what you will need to camp for two nights.

On-site camping services for sanitation, water, trash, and security/fire protection will be provided. Please note that NO FIRES are permitted. Watch for more camping news in upcoming editions.

SPECIAL PROGRAMS:

Climb, battle and slide your way to fun! Come put your climbing skills to the test and challenge the 26' high inflatable rock mountain! Go up against a friend in the gladiator joust! Move those feet as fast as you can in the Bungee Run! Or, take a long ride down the Crazy Slide! These are just some of the many inflatables that will be on hand at JAMBO100! After playing hard all day, get ready for the Saturday night show with eyes to the sky as we cap off the night with a grand fireworks finale!



BOY SCOUT PROGRAM:

We will have something for everyone at JAMBO100. The activities planned for the Boy Scouts will range from the traditional Scouting activities (pioneering, orienteering, first aid, cooking, shooting sports, fishing) to some less traditional (scuba, kayaking, geocaching); from sports (a volleyball tournament, basketball shooting contests) to more cerebral pursuits (chess, science experiments); from historical (military re-enactors, 1910 Boy Scout campsite) to contemporary (RC planes, Model rocket launching, graffiti wall). If nothing we've planned excites you and you'd rather throw Frisbee, at least check out disc golf first.

We would like everyone attending JAMBO100 to bring a three-foot piece of rope to help us create the world's longest chain of square knots. With the number of people expected to attend JAMBO, if every Cub Scout, Boy Scout, Venturer, Leader, parent or other family member brings a piece of rope and ties it into this chain, we could have 8,000 square knots. THAT WOULD BE FIVE MILES OF SQUARE KNOTS! Wouldn't that be awesome?

Our planning to this point has focused on the diversity and breadth of the program for Boy Scouts. Now we need to provide some depth. Boy Scout Leaders, we're looking to you to help. If each unit could provide at least one adult volunteer to work one four hour shift, we will be in great shape. If you have a particular expertise or interest, let us know and we'll try to place you appropriately. From past experience we know that there are always backups at the shooting sports, so if you have expertise and experience in that area, we could especially use your help.



Scuba and kayak pre-registration is required and will be available on the JAMBO100 website; with a deadline for registration of April 2nd. Availability for these two events is limited and will be on a first-come basis. More information along with the required permission slips will be provided after registration closes.

In addition, all early fee registrations will receive their JAMBO100 Patch for free. Late registrations will need to purchase patches during JAMBO weekend. Registration closes for camping on May 1 or earlier if all space is filled, so be sure to register early!
